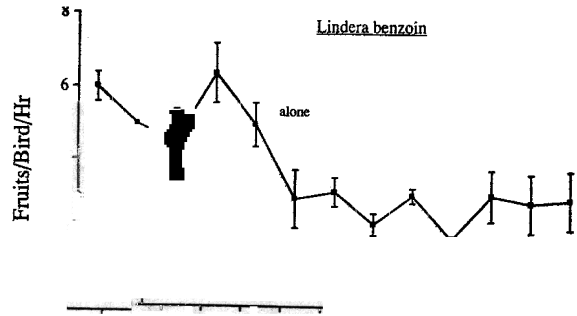
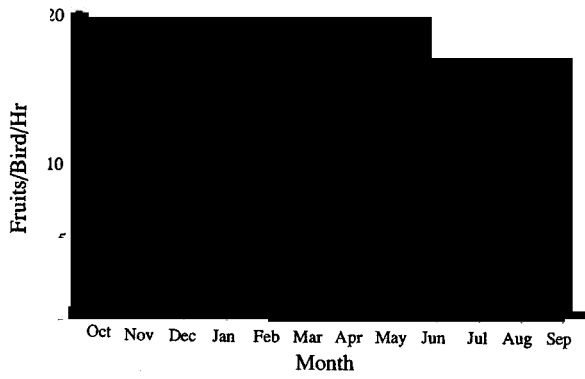


Fig. 1. Consumption rates of *Viburnum dentatum*

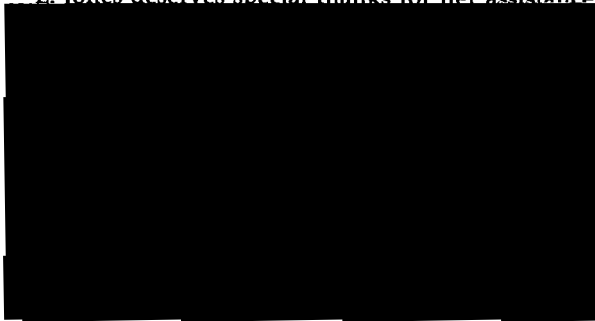


