

This summer I attended an intensive Chinese language program in Beijing, hosted by Princeton University. In the span of eight weeks, we covered an entire year of a Bowdoin language, one hour one-on-one sessions with a professor four days a week, weekly lectures and Chinese table meals exploring local restaurants. This immersive program integrated both classroom learning and real world practice once stepping off campus into the city of Beijing.
